





One Montgomery Green has created the Clean Headwaters program to increase awareness and understanding of the presence of plastics pollution and what we can do about it.



Project Overview

Over the course of six sessions, participants in this program will do hands-on community science to determine the extent of the plastics problem in a Montgomery County stream. Participants will also analyze plastics at Montgomery College, and create action projects to explore possible solutions to the problem. There is opportunity for students to develop valuable science skills, help our communities, and earn student service learning hours.



TIMELINE

The Clean Headwaters project runs in either the Fall or Spring, meeting six times total, with additional optional opportunities. A recognition program will be held at the end of the sessions.
