MONTGOMERY Climate Explorers: In Search of Solutions to Climate Change



ddressing climate change consequences such as heatwaves, extreme weather, air quality, and food safety concerns, the Climate Explorers pilot program will introduce students to fundamental climate change principles and Montgomery County's role in both contributing to and mitigating the climate crisis as well as guiding students in creating strategies to lower greenhouse gas emissions in their high schools.

Project Overview

The Climate Explorers Pilot Program is a 5-session 8-hour after school program to be offered to students in two Montgomery County schools in partnership with school-based educators, community leaders and experts in climate change. The objectives of the Climate Explorers program are

- to introduce Montgomery County high school students to the primary ways Montgomery County contributes to the climate change crisis and to understand local GHG reduction plans;
- to engage students in communitybased activities to identify and measure current or potential consequences of climate change, including climate resiliency and emergency planning
- to develop plans to meet or exceed institutional and/or government targets to reduce GHG emissions from their schools and
- 4) to present the program's results to the broader community.

Our Mission
